Dual Credit and Advanced Placement Courses

Ozona High School students may earn college credit through Dual Credit (DC) college courses and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. College credit courses are available to students during their Junior and Senior years. Dual Credit courses are offered through Midland College. Students enrolled in DC courses take classes from college professors and earn college hours **and** high school credit for courses taken. A student must make at least a C (70-79) to earn high school credit in a dual credit class. Students must pay a fee to enroll in Dual Credit courses and pass the TSI college readiness exam. If students earn an A (90-100) or B (80-89) in a Dual Credit course, they will be reimbursed for a portion of their tuition. Advanced Placement courses are taught by high school teachers. Although there is no tuition required, students must complete summer assignments to qualify to take AP courses. In order to earn college credit for AP courses, students must take an Advanced Placement exam and Score a 3 or higher on the exam.

The following Dual Credit Courses are offered at Ozona High School:

Junior Year

- DC English 1301- semester one
- DC English 1302- semester two
- DC College Algebra- semester one
- DC Pre-Calculus- semester two
- DC US History 1301- semester one
- DC US History 1302- semester two

Senior Year

- DC English 2322- semester one
- DC English 2323- semester two
- DC College Algebra- semester one
- DC Pre-Calculus- semester two **OR** DC Statistics- semester two
- DC Government 2301- semester one
- DC Economics 2301- semester two

The following Advanced Placement courses are offered at Ozona High School:

Junior Year

- AP English Language or AP English Literature- full year (yearly rotation)
- AP US History- full year

Senior Year

- AP English Language or AP English Literature- full year (yearly rotation)
- AP Calculus- full year

- All Dual Credit and Advanced Placement as well as Pre-Advanced Placement courses are incentive courses. Students who take incentive courses earn an extra 10 points on their grades in those courses.
