

PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

The Crockett County Consolidated Common School District believes that all children can learn. We are committed to providing quality educational opportunities for all students. Our children are provided a positive and challenging environment which fosters self-motivated, responsible, life-long learners. Education in the Crockett County Consolidated Common School District is a visible partnership accomplished through the dedicated teamwork of parents, students, community members and the staff.

Parents will be involved in the development and review of this policy by answering surveys, and/or questionnaires, serving on committees at the school level and informal and formal suggestions.

In order to increase the home-school communication an annual meeting (Open House) will occur where parents will meet their child's teacher, learn about the Title 1 requirements, informed on how they can become involved in their child's education. Throughout the year the Parent Liaison, and Counselor will offer parent meeting on how to understand the STAAR and TAKS requirements, any local assessments and helping their child academically. A spring meeting will be held to review the policy and make changes as needed. Parent Liaison will make home visits on teacher and/or principal request.

At the beginning of the year a School-Parent-Teacher Compact will be distributed during Open House that outlines the schools, teachers and parents shared responsibility in the learning environment.

A survey will be taken of all parents to express opinions about the Parent Involvement program and make any improvements as needed.
